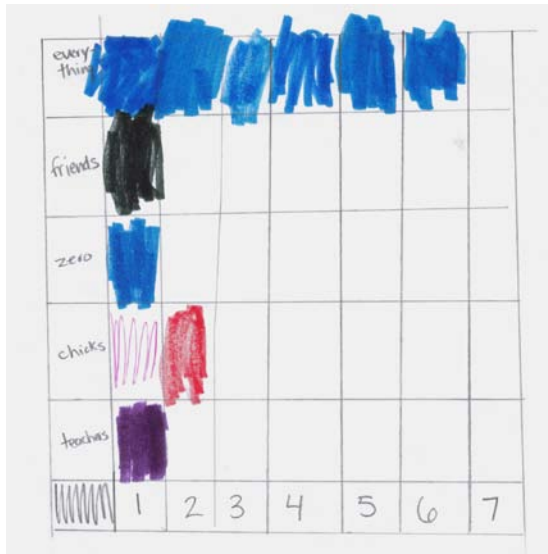

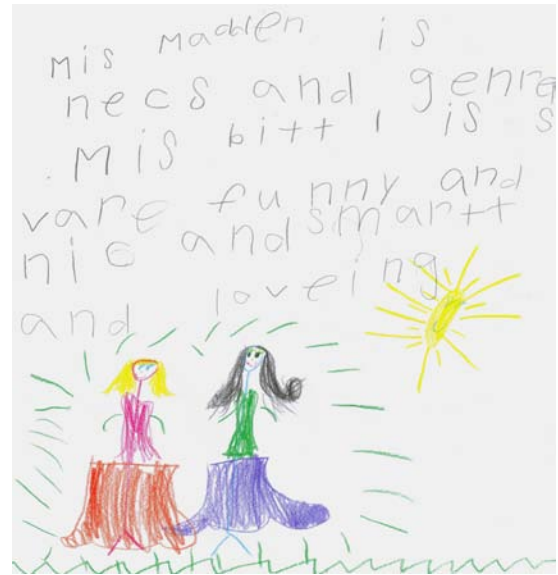

Zero the Hero

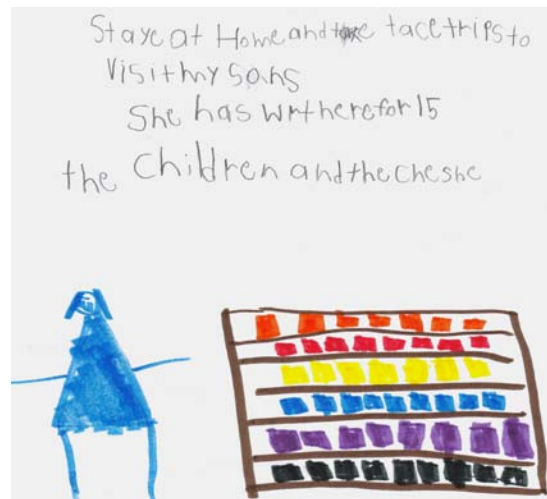

Q: What are you going to do next year?

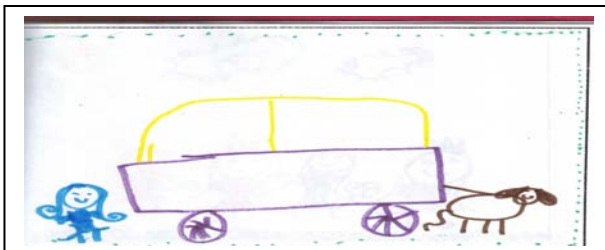
A: Stay at home and take trips to visit her sons.

It has been a great year and we are extremely proud of our eleven kindergarten graduates!

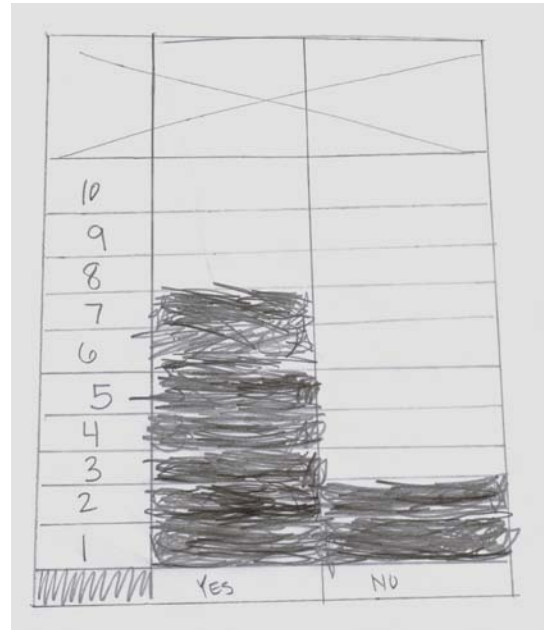
